IDPs	
During the period 1 April 2008 to 9 October 2009	247,073 persons are currently accommodated in camps and hospitals.

RELEASES, RETURNS & TRANSFERS	
Releases:	13,336 people have been released from temporary camps into host families and elders' homes as of 09 October 2009. The majority of these people are elders, people with learning disabilities and other vulnerable groups.
Returns to places of origin:	13,502 have been returned to Jaffna, Vavuniya, Mannar, Trincomalee, Batticaloa and Ampara districts between 05 August and 09 October 2009.
Transfers to the districts of origin and accommodated in transit sites :	Out of a total of 10,709 IDPs transferred to transit sites since 11 and 12 September, 1,749 remain in transit sites in Jaffna, Trincomalee, Batticaloa and Mannar districts. The rest have been added to the 'releases' above.

I. Situation Overview & highlights

- Sri Lanka called upon the US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton to retract her remarks that rape was used as a weapon of war during the 26-year armed conflict. The Minister for Foreign Affairs Rohitha Bogollagama conveyed the Sri Lankan Government's displeasure over the remarks to the new US Ambassador Patricia Butenis, who was summoned for a meeting on 3 October.
- On 4 October, the Minister of Resettlement and Disaster Relief Services Rishad Bathiudeen stated that approximately 10,000 IDPs currently living in Zones 2 and 4 of Menik Farm would be relocated to Zone 6, which is less vulnerable to floods during the upcoming monsoons because of its comparatively higher elevation.
- On 4 October, media reports stated that Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh is considering a proposal by the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu M. Karunanidhi to grant citizenship to Sri Lankan Tamil refugees on Indian soil. Indian political parties have mostly opposed the proposal, insisting that the refugees should be returned to their own country. In Sri Lanka, on 6 October the Minister of National Integration Vinayagamorthy Muralitharan, alias Karuna Amman stated that there was no reason for the Sri Lankan refugees to seek Indian citizenship, as the situation in the country is very good.
- On 5 October, the Secretary to the Ministry of Disaster Management and Human Rights (MDMHR) Prof. Rajiva Wijesingha said that two soldiers involved in the 26 September shooting incident in Menik Farm will be produced for investigation before the military police.
- During his 6-7 October visit to Sri Lanka, the UK Minister for International Development Mike Foster remarked that IDP freedom of movement is critical to averting a humanitarian crisis. After visiting Menik Farm, he voiced concern about the impact that heavy rains would have on camp conditions. Mr. Foster added that the UK is supporting demining and transportation of civilians back to their home areas; however, progress on returning IDPs up to date has been 'disappointing.' He further said that 70% of the people in Menik Farm should be able to immediately leave the camp to stay with their relatives. Following Mr. Foster's visit, the UK Government announced that, once the imminent monsoon is over, it would withdraw all funding except those for life-saving emergency interventions in the camps.
- On 7 October, UNICEF Representative to Sri Lanka, Philippe Duamelle reported a significant improvement in the nutrition condition of IDP children, with a 50% decrease of severe acute malnutrition.
- On 8 October, the Supreme Court ordered the release of an IDP family currently in a Vavuniya camp on the basis of a Fundamental Rights application filed on their behalf. The Supreme Court stated that if the family's next of kin is prepared to take them, there was no reason to continue holding them in the camp.
- On 8 October, the Government of the Russian Federation donated a consignment of humanitarian aid for IDPs. The Minister of Disaster Management and Human Rights Mahinda Samarasinghe said that Russia's decision to provide IDP assistance through the Government of Sri Lanka (GoSL) is significant as other donor nations always operated through the UN and INGOs. Furthermore, two Russian demining specialists arrived in the country to help the demining process in the Northern Province.

JAFFNA

- Between 26 September and 8 October, 4,499 IDPs were transported from Vavuniya camps to Jaffna District. Of this number, 4,408 IDPs went to their own or relatives' homes in the Kayts, Karainagar, Velanai and Delft District Secretariat Divisions. The remaining 91 were transferred to the transit site at Kaithady. On 5 October, 108 pregnant women and their families were brought to Jaffna District and released.
- As of 9 October, 1,643 IDPs from Vavuniya District are being accommodated at the Kaithady and Mirusuvil transit sites in Jaffna District.

TRINCOMALEE

- On 9 October, 448 IDPs from Vavuniya District were transferred to transit sites in Trincomalee District. As of 8 October, 816 individuals have been released from these sites.

MANNAR

- During the reporting period, over 230 IDPs were released from the three Vanni IDP sites in Mannar which includes university students, pregnant mothers with their families, elderly as well as over 150 individuals who were released to return home or to host families in 3 divisions in Mannar. UNHCR will carry out distribution of NFIPacks and shelter assessments for released families.

BATTICALOA

- As of 29 September, there are no more old IDP sites in Batticaloa district. 97 families/321 individuals originating from the High Security Zone were transferred from Kokuvil IDP site in Manmunai North to Kilivetty, Trincomalee. The movement was voluntary and no protection concerns were reported after the inter-agency monitoring. The official number of old IDPs in Batticaloa is now 89 families/433 individuals.

II. Sector Overviews & highlights

SHELTER / NFI

Vavuniya:

- Numerous reports indicating significant tearing and breakdown in the weatherproof canopy of the tents suggest that the Menik Farm tents and shelters are close to or past their useable life. The damage is a result of the age and type of tent, and in some cases, modifications by the IDPs to extend their tents due to congestion. Spot checks confirm reports by the zonal commanders and IDPs of a high number of leaking tents. At Sumathipuram and Veerapuram, there is widespread and substantial damage to the blue Chinese tents.
- There are 4,509 shelter kits and 2,963 tents in stock compared to the 7,000 damaged tents reported up to date in only two zones. There are indications of a similar high proportion of damage in the other zones. The Shelter Sector is concerned that maintaining shelter for IDPs in the Vavuniya camps is now becoming less feasible due to escalating damage and diminishing stocks/resources.
- Shelter maintenance is continuing, although only four agencies currently have the resources to do so and only until 31 December 2009. It is increasingly more challenging to fill the maintenance gaps. Some agencies are declining maintenance and gap-filling due to policy, donor constraints etc. Furthermore, the four agencies still engaged in maintenance are overextended due to commitments in drainage and now decommissioning of tents to conserve repair materials.
- In Site 6B, to which IDPs were recently transferred from Zone 4, many shelters were damaged while the site remained empty. Repairs are underway, but progress is slow.
- The Shelter Sector has recommended that, in principle, shelters and tents should not be replaced. Case-by-case replacement on a prioritised basis can be undertaken within the limits of the current stocks. It is imperative to reserve stocks to address the anticipated monsoon damage. Shelter agencies have agreed that the decision could be revisited in case of a crisis arising from adverse weather conditions.
- IDP transfers within Menik Farm, from areas at risk of groundwater or potential flooding during the monsoons, have already started. The IDPs were moved before the sections of a zone being vacated could be isolated from the still occupied portions. As a result, the remaining IDPs are rapidly looting the vacated tents, for use as extensions to their own tents. In one day, 244 tents were removed by IDPs. Faced with the prospect of losing all vacated tents, a decision has been taken to decommission and store them for potential recycling of parts.
- The SLA is seeking to have Site 8 connected to electricity on a priority basis, in order that the site can be used for transfers from Zones 2 and 3. At the time of writing, the electricity is still not connected and IDP transfers to Site 8 from Menik farm have been deferred.
- The SLA has identified 23 schools as evacuation sites for additional IDP relocations from Menik Farm during the monsoons. Consequently, sections of the schools should continue to operate or alternative resources should be provided to minimise the disruption to the students' education – particularly in light of the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) examination in December. The Shelter Sector is

trying to assess the schools as potential contingency sites. However several agencies have declined either due to drainage and/or maintenance commitments or donor constraints with respect to continued support for Menik Farm.

- The progress of road and surface drainage continues to be a concern with the imminent arrival of the monsoon rains. The Disaster Management Centre (DMC) and the SLA undertook to complete surface drainage in the SLA blocks. They have, however, approached Shelter agencies, to fund surface drainage, indicating a lack of funds. The Shelter Sector has secured capacity and gap-filling for all surface drainage with the exception of 19 blocks in Zone 1, 3 blocks in Zone 5 and the transit sites.
- As of 9 October, drainage progress stood as follows:
 - Zone 0: Surface drainage is at 60%. The SLA has not started on road drainage but are cleaning out the existing shallow drains.
 - Zone 1: The DMC reports road drainage as 95% complete; maintenance is required. An agency has completed approximately 50% of surface drainage in 3 blocks out of 22. The other 19 blocks will be allocated once agency capacity becomes available.
 - Zone 2: Road drainage is 100% complete. Surface drainage is 80% complete with follow-up work required.
 - Zone 3: Road drainage is 95% complete, with surface drainage at 90%. Follow-up work is required.
 - Zone 4: Road drainage is assessed at 90% overall completion. Many drainage excavation trenches have partially filled up due to the recent rains and need maintenance. Surface drainage is 75% complete, requiring follow-up.
 - Zone 5: Road drainage is 95% and surface drainage 90% complete. Many drains need manual levelling and side shaping, while the entire site requires additional culverts. The SLA has improved the erosion protection of the main access road culverts. There are concerns about the site's current drainage capacity.
 - Site 6A: Road drainage is at 85% and surface drainage at 95% completion. Additional follow-up may be required.
 - Site 6B: Road drainage is 55% complete. An agency has undertaken to complete all surface drainage.
 - Site 7: The SLA/DMC are yet to start on road drainage. Surface drainage is reported by agencies to be 80% complete.
 - Site 8: Road drainage is 80% complete. Surface drainage is yet to begin as the site remains empty.
- The Shelter Sector continues to provide information to the NGO Internews to support drainage safety, fire safety and shelter maintenance initiatives in the press and on radio. Advocacy flyers are currently being produced in Tamil for dissemination to IDPs.
- Area Focal Points were appointed to coordinate the issue of rainy season NFIs to the camps and transit sites. Also, items from various agencies will be assembled as complete kits prior to distribution to maximise the use of trucks. Despite a 20 October deadline, distribution has been delayed as food containers and slippers were not dispatched in time. These items may arrive before the end of this week.
- There are serious gaps in some of the NFIs issued to the IDPs, while other items have worn out pretty fast. Four specific items were singled out as most needed: buckets, basins, mosquito nets and floor mats, but significant gaps are reported.
- An ongoing assessment is trying to establish the number of families which, for one reason or the other, did not receive kitchen sets. The survey was undertaken after the Food Sector reported that some families had missed out on the initial distribution. Plans are also underway to start the distribution of kitchen sets to IDPs in the Veerapuram, Dharmapuram and Sumathipuram sites in preparation for individual cooking. Issuance of kitchen sets to the transit sites will start next week as well.
- Henceforth, the coordination of hygiene kits has been handed over to the WASH Sector.

Jaffna

- With an eye on the monsoons, agencies are repairing emergency shelters in the 'new' IDP sites, i.e., those established after December 2008, as well in the 'old' welfare centres accommodating long-term IDPs.

- The Shelter and WASH Sectors are partnering with Government authorities to assess the needs of recent IDP returnees. Currently, the work is focused on the islands, to where over 6,000 persons have returned. Immediate needs are covered through the provision of a tarpaulin kit. Some agencies have started to provide transitional shelters in Mankumban and in Manatkadu.
- The distribution of NFIs to IDPs in Jaffna camps continues. In addition, more than 2,500 return kits, that include standard NFIs, hygiene items, a tarpaulin kit and an array of tools, were distributed to released and returned families in Jaffna District. University students, recently released from Vavuniya camps, have also received a standard NFI kit.

WASH

Vavuniya:

- The ongoing dry spell has reduced the water levels in the Malwathu Oya to an extent, which threatens the two intakes from the river. As a result, a limited amount of water is being delivered to the water treatment plants in Zones 2, 3 and next to Zone 4 of Menik Farm.
- The low groundwater levels have also affected tubewells, as well as the shallower dug wells. Much of the water needed for survival will have to be bowsered in to the zones – a very costly operation given limited resources.
- During this crisis, the drinking water delivered to the zones averages around 6 litres per person per day across Menik Farm, ranging from 2 to 25 litres per person per day. The Irrigation Department has agreed to release up to 500 cubic metres per day from an upstream reservoir to boost water levels in the Malwathu Oya. The WASH Sector has undertaken other coping strategies, including identifying dug wells that need to be cleaned, assigning agencies to create bowser points, finding pumps to equip dug wells etc. Large storage facilities are being installed as close to the camps as possible to act as bowser points and bowser supplies are being redirected to those zones with less water.
- The office of the Assistant Commissioner for Local Government (ACLG) has begun monitoring WASH facilities according to the plan developed with Sector support. Preliminary data indicates that Zone 2 has more problems than any other zone, while Zone 3 is in the best condition. The ACLG and Sector agencies will now be able to concentrate resources where they are most needed. The ACLG's gully sucking fleet will be directed to Zone 2 and agency maintenance teams will be sent to the key blocks.

Jaffna

- At the coordination meeting held on 29 September, WASH agencies agreed that sector support for resettlement should follow a standard guideline, including toilet construction. Also, contingency plans for the rainy season were finalised and partner agencies assigned to maintain WASH facilities in IDP camps.
- WASH agencies are improving toilet facilities in the Ramavil IDP camps, by constructing elevated pits to avoid flooding during the upcoming rainy season.
- On 29 September and 02 October, UN agencies and Government partners assessed the needs of returnees to the Kayts and Velanai Islands. The WASH Sector participated in the assessment. WASH needs in the Mankumban and Mandaitivu villages were identified in consultation with the community.

NUTRITION

Vavuniya:

- Critical supplies (of high energy biscuits, BP 100 etc) for the nutrition programme are being pre-positioned closer to the nutrition rehabilitation centres in Menik Farm to ease delivery in case road conditions deteriorate during the wet weather.

- Results of the nutrition survey in Menik Farm indicate a reduction of Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) by 50% and Moderately Acute Malnutrition (MAM) by 5%.

Jaffna:

- The Nutrition Rehabilitation Programme and supplementary feeding programmes continue at all IDP camps and for the entire Jaffna District.

HEALTH

Vavuniya:

- The Health Sector has supported the Rehabilitation Ward and the Centre for the Disabled at the Mannar General Hospital through purchases of equipment, training of health professionals, provision of water supplies to the buildings etc.
- Health Contingency planning is continuing and the final document will be produced shortly.

Jaffna:

- The Health Sector continues to support the office of the Regional Director of Health Services (RDHS) to screen the nutritional status of resettled children for inclusion in the therapeutic and supplementary feeding programmes.

PROTECTION

Vavuniya:

- Protection agencies followed up on protection concerns in the IDP camps and continued to monitor IDP departures from Vavuniya District to various districts of origin. Since 5 August 9,707 IDPs have left Vavuniya District to their places of origin.
- Protection monitoring of IDPs at the Collection Centres continues. In Andiyapuliyanjulam School, 1,527 IDPs, who were to have travelled to Trincomalee on 13 September, are still waiting to leave. They have now been in the Collection Centre for 26 days.
- A total of 12,680 IDPs with special needs have been released from the sites in Vavuniya. Since 26 September, an accelerated release of pregnant women is occurring from Menik Farm. A total of 313 such families were transported to Jaffna District. A further 343 individuals are staying at a temple in Vavuniya awaiting clearance to be transported to Jaffna District. Protection teams continue to assist and monitor the women in the temple until their departure.
- On 1 October, a new form for the release of IDPs to host families was introduced in Vavuniya District. The new procedures require that the host family be registered as voters in the relevant polling division and be able to ensure food and accommodation for the IDPs.
- Protection agencies are working closely with the police and ministries represented in Menik Farm on issues related to Sexual and Gender Based Violence (SGBV). Government authorities, NGOs and UN agencies met on 30 September to discuss the implementation of a prevention and response mechanism for SGBV.
- On 8 October, Protection agencies met with the Social Services Department to coordinate activities and discuss the development of a referral mechanism.

Jaffna:

- Protection agencies continue monitoring in the Vanni IDP camps and the new transit sites holding people from the Vavuniya IDP camps. However, there is no access to the transit sites on the islands.
- Protection agencies continue to monitor released/returned IDPs, particularly those who have been released to the islands. A needs assessment and identification of vulnerable cases is underway to

determine assistance to this group.

CHILD PROTECTION

Vavuniya:

- During the reporting period, a Child Friendly Unit was opened in Zone 3 of Menik Farm.
- The UK Minister for Development Mike Foster went to the Poonthodham Cooperative Training Centre during his visit to Vavuniya District. He saw the Temporary Learning Space at the Centre and talked to several young people attending classes, engaged in vocational training or playing sports.

Jaffna:

- From 7-8 October, a training programme on Community-based Child Protection Systems was conducted for several organisations. The aim of the programme was to develop a much broader community-based child protection network.
- Jaffna Probation Officers have now been granted permission to access the IDP camps and the new transit sites. They will assess the status of vulnerable children in these sites.
- A list of separated, orphan, unaccompanied and other vulnerable children was submitted to the Jaffna Government Agent for necessary action to secure their release.

EDUCATION

Vavuniya:

- The deployment of teachers remains an unresolved issue in the Menik Farm schools. A rapid assessment by the Education Sector during the first week of October revealed that 843 volunteer teachers work in the Temporary Learning Spaces (TLS). Their contribution is key to guaranteeing continued education for all IDP children.
- The Education Sector anticipates a serious disruption of school activities during the monsoons, with TLSs probably being used as evacuation areas. Agencies have adopted response strategies, such as strengthening TLS infrastructure, strengthening community ownership, digging trenches, upgrading and maintenance of TLSs.

Jaffna:

- In partnership with the respective Education zonal office, Education Sector agencies conducted an assessment of the school supplies and clothing required by newly-resettled students in the islands.
- Nearly 700 resettled students in Jaffna District have received fabric for school uniforms from the Department of Education; the tailoring charges will be met by Education Sector agencies.

Trincomalee:

- The Education Sector is supporting the Northern Provincial Department of Education to conduct catch-up classes for students in the Pulmoddai IDP camp sitting for the upcoming General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) examination in December. The classes are conducted over the weekend and will continue until the examinations start.

LOGISTICS

- IOM continues to provide transport for IDPs to return destinations and for relocations to other camp zones. The convoys sent to Jaffna are commercially hired vehicles with a military escort.
- The Inter-Agency Logistics Meeting is also identifying gaps in monsoon preparedness by maintaining

an inventory of the actions taken by its partners. Input received up to now indicates that enough storage capacity is available, but that many agencies are dependent on commercial transport.

- Inter-Agency Logistics Vavuniya is liaising with the DMC to implement a one-way road system in Menik Farm to avoid unnecessary damage to roads and congestion in the camp. It will be implemented when roads signs are put up.

EARLY RECOVERY

Jaffna:

- The Sector has proposed standardised livelihood packages for returnees to the Deputy Director for Agriculture and the Assistant Director of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources to avoid ad-hoc assistance.
- According to preliminary data collected by the respective District Secretariat offices, the returnees' needs are tentatively estimated as follows: 1,237 temporary shelters; 779 toilets; 276 families require assistance for agricultural activity; 742 families require assistance for fisheries livelihoods; 97 families require assistance for micro-enterprises.

The ACLG's gully sucking fleet can now be directed to Zone 2, and the agency maintenance teams to the key blocks.</i></p> <p>UNICEF reviewed and agreed on proposal submitted by Rural Development Fund (RDF) for the development of the 3 step PHAST toolkit to be used the stakeholders training for hygiene promotion in IDP camps.</p> <p>UNICEF held a discussion MoH Deputy Director of IDP Health on HP volunteers and Health Promoters responsibilities and coordination mechanisms, to avoid a conflict of roles between the two community animation groups.
