3.8a	Description (free text)	<p align="center">MINE RISK EDUCATION</p> <p>Name of the project : MRE Donor : UNICEF Reporting Period : April to June 2005</p> <p>During the period of April to June 2005 –Many activities had been carried out in this project in Mannar, Puttalam, Vavuniya, and Anuradhapura.</p>												

		<p>Through the community liaisons it was able to communicate with more than 2658 people in our Mine Risk Education areas during this period. The coordination with FSD, Sarvatra, Horizon and JCCP etc. and ensured the smooth de-mining process and was able to conduct many coordination meetings regarding the Mine action week campaign. The meetings with relevant NGOs and government sectors had been reached up to 165 where it created many occasions to discuss the issues. First we assessed people's knowledge by filling the attitude practice (KAP) form. Distribution of posters and leaflets was taken place across many villages.</p> <p>Community briefing: - It was able to do 295 community briefing during the period RDS, NGO staffs and other CBOs participated and was able to aware them with basic ideas on mine risk education. We also distributed handbills and stickers among the participants. Total house visits reached up to 4250.</p> <p>Training programs: - 30 MRE staffs participated in IMSMA and benefited through this program. Further 2 days training program for volunteers in every operation district were carried out. Totally 123 volunteer participated in these training.</p> <p>Presentations: - It was able to make 150 presentations across four districts. Through the direct presentation people draw 5 maps to indicate the dangerous areas in their villages. The coverage was 68% of population from 62 villages with the number of 18,229 community members in four districts during this period which included 7025 males, 6250 females and 4954 children. Three review meetings were conducted. During this period 6 UXOs were reported to the DMAO.</p>

		<p>Reporting Period : April to June 2005</p> <p>Seven workshops were conducted in April for the school children of the project area. 280 students were involved from seven schools where it includes locals and IDPs. Grade nine to eleven were the main participants. Ikkirigollawa, Patthawa, Angunochchi, Ganewalpola, Kollangkuttiyagama, Bamunugama and Bandarapathathan were the main villages for these workshops.</p> <p>24 principals were participated in a one day program which was held in Sampath training Center in Anuradahpura on 27.05.2005. Two workshops were held on 13.04.2005 and 14.04.2005 in Ganewalpola and Bamunugama in the respective dates. TOT reprograms for teachers were held on 27 to 29 April in the Sampath Training Center. 24 teachers from 12 schools participated in this program. Child rights were focused in depth.</p> <p>During May 2005, 180 mothers participated in the migrant mothers' workshop. It was held in five villages of the project area. Child right, child abuse and parental care were the main focus areas and in depth discussion were held during the session. Horawapothana, Pattawa, Ikkirigollawa, Angunochchi, Horappola were the main village for these workshops.</p> <p>In June 2005, workshops for mother were held in the title as child rights and sexual abuses. 114 mothers participated. Workshop for students also held and 240 students were in the 10 workshops. During the workshop on sexual abuses and child rights totally 272 students participated from grade nine to eleven. On 26.06.2005 two hundred children were gathered in Kekeirawa Tharuna Seva. Children clubs were registered and a network for students was created which includes 12 DS divisions.</p>
